<b>11. Cultural Heritage Colloquium (Day)/Interdisciplinary Study (Pathways)*</b>

**For transfer students with 45-69 units, the total colloquium requirement is 6 units. For transfer students with 70 or more units or second degree candidates, the total requirement is 3 units. Remaining units must be taken at Dominican University at the upper division level.**
