## Mills College General Education Matrix for Transfer Students

Eight of the ten general education requirements at Mills College can be met in a number of ways, including transfer credit or relevant AP courses. For transfer purposes, one course may satisfy up to two general education requirements.

Community college students who are considering transferring to Mills College and who wish to complete general education requirements before they transfer can use the matrix below as a guide to help them choose appropriate courses. Please note, however, that Mills College does not require that any specific courses be completed before transferring.

A course used to fulfill a general education requirement must be worth at least 3 semester units or 4 quarter units.

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
