## **OVERALL REQUIREMENTS**

Candidates for the Associate Degree must complete at least 60 units to include courses in a Major, General Education, and Electives, as necessary (see catalog for details).

- 1. A minimum grade-point average of 2.0 ("C") is required in **EACH** of the following:
  - Overall grade-point average
  - General Education requirements
- 2. A minimum grade of "C" or better is required in **EACH COURSE** in the major, English Composition (Area 4A), and Mathematics (Area 4B).
- 3. At least 12 units must be completed at Laney.
- 4. Students must complete a minimum of 19 units distributed among Areas 1, 2, 3, 4a, 4b, 4c, 4d and 5.

NOTE: While a course might satisfy more than one General Education requirement, it may not be counted more than once for this purpose (see exception for Ethnic Studies courses).

## **GRADUATION EVALUATION**

It is the student's responsibility to file a "Petition for an Associate Degree" by the deadline specified in the College Academic Calendar, (available in the catalog, class schedule or website).
