They will be exempted but will not have priority registration. Note: if students are part of a special program they will keep the right for priority registration. Put completed form in Lesley's inbox. BCC and COA will not accept orientation taken at other PCCD campuses, but Merritt and Laney will. Assessment and orientation schedule: Students must now complete their orientation before taking the assessment. There are very few f2f orientations, most students will have to do them online and print the confirmation page to bring it to the assessment.
