Please use the ORIENT and ASSESS codes if you see a student who has brought proof of completion to the appointment in addition to other relevant codes.</p> <p>REMINDER: Please pay attention to the drop in list!</p> <p><i>CCCAssess & AB 705</i> The Chancellor's Office has decided to terminate the CCCAssess project. "a preponderance of evidence demonstrates that standardized assessments are no longer seen as an effective placement strategy." The focus now will be on multiple measures for placement purposes: noncognitive variables and high school transcripts.</p> <p>AB 705 was signed into law by Gov. Brown and will be in effect 1/2018. Colleges must maximize the probability that a student will enter and complete transfer level coursework in English and Math within one year. ESL within three years. High school information must be used and guided placement including self-placement. Lesley will be meeting with the English consultant and others regarding this and will provide updates.</p>
