The Associate Degree – Transfer (ADT) in Sociology passed CIC and believes the degree will be offered starting Fall 2015. The following three courses will be offered as part of the degree: Soc 120, Soc 13, & Soc 45. She asked the Counselors to recommend that students take Soc 1 before Soc 2. Students will have the option of taking the ADT in Sociology fully online. Dr. Clay hopes that Soc 120 will satisfy CSU general education Math/Quantitative Reasoning requirement. Soc 120 does not have a Math prerequisite, so discussion regarding whether or not this would satisfy CSU GE/Breadth.
