Discussed lacked of F2F sections of CIS & Business classes and the challenge for students and counselors to plan when courses are not offered at this campus b) Potential nursing student with remediation plan from the Nursing Department. Student was very happy and hopeful that she may enter the program at Merritt once she completes recommended ESL classes. In spite of having passed English 1A and Engl 5, counselor pointed out to the group the need to support the student from their own perspective and value system. c) CoA student applied to UCSC for a CIS major. Assist.org listed that all major prep must be completed. Transfer counselor to wait to hear from admitting institution and provide ideas of what actions to take if student is not accepted.	All

- The District Education Committee has 32 members, which consists of the Interim Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs (Dr. Luis Pedraja), AVC of Student Services, all VPIs, all VPSSs, all Academic Senate Presidents, an instructional faculty representative from all 4 colleges, a student services faculty representative from all 4 colleges, the PFT President, the District Academic Senate President, a District Technology Committee representative, a District Facilities Committee representative, a classified representative from each college, and two student government representatives.
